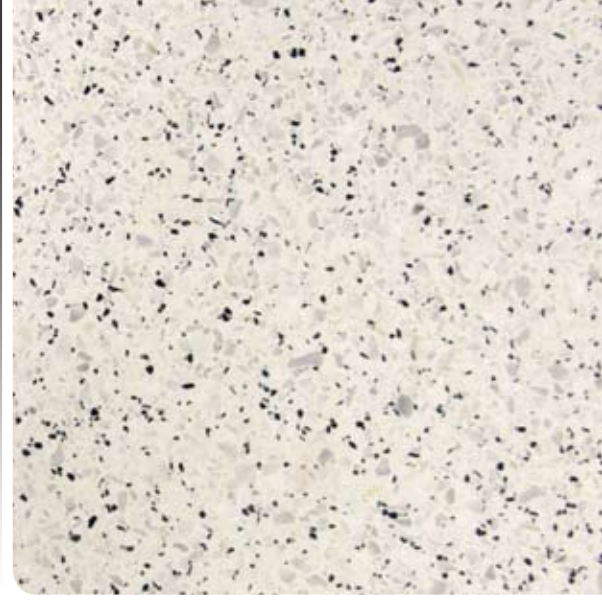

TERRAZZO



Material:

Composite material poured in place or precast and installed as tiles. It consists of stone aggregates, normally marble but also granite, glass and synthetic aggregates can be used and poured out together with a binder that is either cement, resin based or a combination of both. When cured the terrazzo material is ground and polished to a smooth surface.

Characteristics:

A wide range of colours is available from white to black. The binder material is generally "softer" than the aggregates which gives an uneven surface on old, worn down tiles. Relatively soft stone that can be recognized through as being (SPRÄCKLIG)

Availability:

Terrazzo floors are commonly found in e.g. retail stores and shopping malls – especially in northern Europe.

TWISTER on Terrazzo:

Suitable for TWISTER upgrades (Standard, Intensive and Extreme) and daily maintenance with Green pad Ideal material as Terrazzo takes polish relatively easy and a good gloss level can be expected on tiles in good condition. A worn down terrazzo surface will be clean and shiny but due to its properties light reflection will show an uneven surface.

Description/how to recognize

Composite material, binder with aggregates.
Speckled appearance

Attributes/softness

High/medium softness.

How to use TWISTER

Ideal for upgrade (intensive and standard) and daily maintenance.
Dry buffing effective for higher gloss.

Expected result/tips and tricks

Easiest stone to get a good result on -High gloss on tiles in good condition due to softness of stone. Worn Terrazzo will be clean and shiny but uneven surface will reduce light reflection.
